2 This Act may be cited as the "Foreign Agents Trans

7 (a) Obligation.—The third sentence of section 2(a
8 of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, a
9 amended (22 U.S.C. 612(a)) is amended by striking "fo
10 the period" and inserting "covering the period".
11 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
12 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to any individua

23 (a) CONTINUAL COMPLIANCE.—Section 8(f) of the
24 Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended (22
25 U.S.C. 618(f)) is amended—

1	(1) by inserting after the first sentence the fol-
2	lowing: "The Attorney General may make applica-
3	tion for an order requiring a person to comply with
4	any appropriate provision of this Act or any regula-
5	tion thereunder while the person acts as an agent of
6	a foreign principal or at any time thereafter."; and
7	(2) by striking the period at the end and insert-
8	ing the following: ", including an order requiring a
9	person to comply with section 2 with respect to any
10	period during which the person acts as the agent of
11	a foreign principal notwithstanding that the person
12	does not act as the agent of a foreign principal at
13	the time the court issues the order.".
14	(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by

23	SEC. 4. ANNUAL REPORTS RELATING TO COMPLIANCE.
24	(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

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1	(1) the term "covered action" means an action
2	taken by the Attorney General against a covered in-
3	dividual to enforce the Foreign Agents Registration
4	Act of 1938, as amended (22 U.S.C. 611 et seq.),
5	as amended by sections 2 and 3 of this Act; and
6	(2) the term "covered individual" means an in-
7	dividual who served as the agent of a foreign prin-
8	cipal under the Foreign Agents Registration Act of
9	1938, as amended (22 U.S.C. 611 et seq.) during
10	the 5-year period ending on the date of enactment
11	of this Act.
12	(b) In General.—Not later than 1 year after the
13	date of enactment of this Act, and each year from that
14	date thereafter, the Attorney General shall submit to the
15	Committee on the Judiciary and the Committee on For-
16	eign Relations of the Senate and the Committee on the
17	Judiciary of the House of Representatives, as well as any
18	other Member of Congress upon request of such Member,
19	a written, machine-readable report that describes each
20	covered action taken by the Attorney General.
21	(c) Organization.—Each report submitted under
22	subsection (b) shall be organized by each covered action
23	taken and shall include, with respect to each covered ac-
24	tion—

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1	(1) the name of each covered individual against
2	whom the covered action was taken;
3	(2) a description of the rationale behind taking
4	the covered action; and
5	(3) the status of the covered action.
